Organize a "Hygiene Kit" drive to collect personal care items and assemble supplies into kits. The kits can be delivered to PATH where our street outreach team will distribute the needed supplies to homeless men and women living on the streets.

Individuals and groups who host hygiene kit drives gain tremendous satisfaction in knowing each kit will be delivered directly into the hands of those in need.

Elements of a Hygiene Kit

We rely heavily on the generosity of volunteers to meet this urgent and basic need. Here are the suggested items to gather (new travel size items only please!)



Popular Hygiene Kit Items

- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Hair care products (gel, mouse, etc.)
- Soap
- Body Wash
- Lotion/Sunscreen
- Lip Balm with SPF 15
- Toothbrushes
- Toothpaste
- Dental Floss
- Deodorant
- Anti-bacterial wipes
- Hand Sanitizer
- Socks

For Men

- Shaving cream
- Disposable razors
- Combs

For Women

- Feminine hygiene products
- Hair Ties
- Brushes

Bonus Items

- Nail Clippers
- Gum / Mints

The most useful way these items are given out is in 1-gallon plastic bags. You are welcome to personalize kits with note cards containing inspirational quotes or messages and the name of your group, but we ask that you refrain from including personal contact information.
